



PROJECT: Sisters of Notre Dame, Waterdown, Ontario

PRODUCT: Optimum Series Double Awnings, Casements and Shapes with Sandalwood exterior and Redwood interior

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS:

The project was a renovation and conversion from a school to a residence for 80 Sisters of the Roman Catholic Church of a 4-storey 1927 masonry building. The architect required high performance, low maintenance windows that would compliment the architecture of this historical building. Supply and installation was required with full warranties from one source. Ease of operation was a must due to largely elderly residents.

OUTSTANDING FEATURES:

The Optimum Series double Awning windows with standard extruded aluminum exterior in Sandalwood with baked enamel finish ideally suited the intriguing architecture of this building. Top sashes were enhanced with internal grills in 3x2 colonial pattern. The interior of the windows were finished in white to match the vinyl glazing stops. Choice of finish provided windows with a very low maintenance exterior and minimum maintenance on the interior. Plentiful ventilation and ease of operation was provided with operators on the bottom sashes. With their unique triple seal system the Optimum Series windows provide a barrier against air, noise, water and wind.
